Pre-StarSkate

Pre-StarSkate is a learn-to-figure skate program. This program includes instruction in basic skating skills as well as jumps, spins, and field moves.(Spirals etc) Pre-StarSkate is taught in groups (max.4 skaters per group, with instruction by professional coaches. Pre-StarSkate is also an excellent bridge from CanSkate to StarSkate for skaters wishing to test and compete. All Pre-StarSkaters will have the opportunity to compete in the Performance Event taking place in March

Appropriate Dress and Equipment

Pre-StarSkaters must wear figure skates and proper skating attire. For girls this consists of body suit and skating skirt, or skating dress and skating tights. Leggings may be worn, however they must be tight fitting on the legs/hips and allow for movement. For boys proper skating attire consists of track pants and warm top. No baggy track suits, hooded sweatshirts, or jeans. Helmets are not required. Skate guards must be worn off ice.
